

## CRRSA Act Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II Quarterly Report for Quarter Ending December 31, 2021

1. An acknowledgment that the institution signed and returned the Certification and Agreement form & the assurance that the institution has used, or intends to use, no less than the required amount of funds received to provide HEERF grants to students.

San Jacinto College signed a Certification and Agreement with the US Department of Education to receive funds appropriated under CRRSA Act. San Jacinto College will use the funds received to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement [for] Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

The US Department of Education authorize San Jacinto College to distribute \$4,475,232 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students.

As of December 31, 2021, \$4,475,232 have been distributed to students.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive HEERF grants.

Approximately 40,000 students could be eligible to receive an Emergency Financial Aid Grant.

5. The total number of students who have received an HEERF grant.

As of December 31, 2021, 5,941 students received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant.

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive HEERF grants and how much they would receive.

Students are asked to complete an application where they select expenses they accrued as a result of the disruption of campus operations. The application also gave students the option to authorize the College to apply their grant to tuition and fees charges including outstanding charges. The items selected by an individual student are totaled according to the estimated amount. Students whose FAFSA data resulted in an Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) that falls within the highest EFC eligible for a Pell Grant were considered to have exceptional need. These students received an award of \$700 funds even if they do receive Pell for the current aid year. Students with an EFC greater than the Pell eligible EFC or no EFC received an award of \$600.

7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the HEERF grants.

San Jacinto College sent an email to all students enrolled at any point during the spring 2020 semester through the fall 2021 semester to inform them about the availability of the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.
